FLOATING THE GIANT

Prospectus of the New Company Issued in London.

The Giant a Dazzler as it is Therein Described.

(From our own Correspondent.) LONDON, July 19.—Since last I wrote you considerable interest has transpired in London affecting British Columbia properties.
