"Greater activity has been displayed by the artillery, especially in the region of Dixmude. In the course of the afternoon, two German balloons before our front broke from their moorings and fell, one into the sea opposite La Panne, the other near Coudelzerque. The aronauts were made prisoner."

In the afternoon a German captive balloon broke loose and drifted northwards at a great height, passing over our lines east of Bethune.
