REPORT OF DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR.

Concluded.

Our potatoes are the best in the world for the table, dry, mealy, and delicious, and the potato crop has been for years our principal root crop.

Plums and Peaches.—The former were an immense crop, and peaches were also very abundant. The price was low, but the crop brought far more money than the short crop of '87 with high figures.

Tomatoes.—There was too much rain and too little sunshine for tomatoes, and the crop was almost a failure.

Cucumbers.—The pickling factories in Gasperau induced our farmers to try cucumbers, and a number raised several bushels and found the crop profitable.

Apples.—We have placed the most important and valuable crop for export, the crown and glory of our valley, last. The crop is a good one. Gravensteins will average the immense yield of '86, but other varieties will fall short, and a few are a failure.
