As an alternative he may remain subject to a call from the roadmaster as often as his turn for this branch of service may come around. Other farm produce is marketed with equal facility. Nor is the congestion of traffic at the station and warehouses as marked as one would anticipate. Cars are always coming in goodly numbers, and the train service has been well up to schedule all winter. The management deserves a great deal of credit for the excellent service it has rendered its patrons.
