Hemlock Bark.

There is a good stock of hemlock bark in this Province, but it is in a very fair way for being speedily exhausted. We are delighted to find the following in the Surveyor General's pamphlet, touching upon this subject: "Hemlock is principally cut for its bark which is used in the many tanneries throughout the Province in the manufacture of leather. At present there is a great demand for this bark, and unless more stringent measures be used for the preservation of this valuable tree, before many years the supply will be exhausted."

We may say that the Shaw Brothers, who tan on an immense scale, have come to New Brunswick with a view to establishing extract factories here. One of these expressing mills will be put up near Pokok, the other near Millville. The bark extracted they will chiefly use in their own tanneries established in many parts of the Union.

We are of the opinion this state of affairs should not be tolerated. There is a large quantity of hemlock forest in Maine, but Messrs Shaw are letting that stand till they strip our forests of all their hemlock. A few extract factories will soon do that; and the one soon to be established calls for immediate action by the Government. If we are to take the pamphlet above quoted as an index of the Executive mind, we see no difficulties in the way of getting in a proper bill.

We think a measure might be introduced tending to quadruple the present stampage on hemlock bark, for extract purposes; with a view to the preservation of the valuable hemlock tree. This would meet all the ends required; we hope the Surveyor General will be in a position to advise the House would handsomely support his bill.

OF FOR MISSOURI. It is always with feelings of regret that we chronicle the departure of those who are a loss to the community in which they live. We regret to-day to announce that Mr. Chas. E. Perks has made up his mind to bid adieu to Fredericton and start for St. Joseph, Missouri, on Saturday next. Mr. Perks has been a number of years engaged in the Dry Goods trade here, spending the most of his time with Mr. P. McPeake and McDonald & Keady. He proposes to enter the Dry Goods business also in St. Joseph, and we can only say we congratulate the firm that will be fortunate enough to secure his services. THE EXPENSES OF HIS DEPARTMENT. He had occasion in visiting the public works under the management to travel through Gloucester, but he had been charged with an hon. gentleman for claiming too large a sum for his expenses. The hon. gentleman accounting him gave an estimate of what would cost him to travel by rail; but he did not go by rail, but by the high road, from one end of the county to the other. He found it necessary to do this, and had made it a point never to be satisfied with anything but his eye view of works under his charge. He had endeavored to curtail the travelling expenses of his department and he thought he had succeeded. [We may say here, that travelling expenses of the Board of Works Department have been brought down to a respectable figure. Here is a table of the expenses of the office for the past 11 years:

The years in brackets are the two years during which Mr. Landry has held office. He has received a salary of \$50 of Vice-Regal expenditure to the travelling expenses, and some \$25 are carried over from last year, which would leave the travelling expenses of his department \$845. We think if there was any honor or any decency in these "criticisms" of the House, they would give credit for such worthy effort as the Chief Commissioner has put forth in this regard.—Ed.] He had endeavored to cut down the expenses in every department under his control. For example the item paid for fuel was, he thought too large, and instead of accepting a private contract he had himself been done, he put it up for public competition, and the result was he obtained wood 70 cts. or 80 cts. per cord cheaper than he otherwise would have been; this was hardly worth talking about, but he thought it would answer the charge of extravagance made against him by some honorable gentleman. He saw a bill on the files of the House, providing for taking an inventory of the effects at Government House, but that was just what he had done shortly after taking office. Any hon. gentleman who wished to see the list, he would be pleased to accommodate. He had been charged from different quarters with the expense attending the Vice-Regal visit; but he had given all possible attention to the expenditures, and kept up a constant correspondence with clerks when he was not present himself. But if his memory served him aright when the expenditures were being made, he saw the leader of the Opposition on the premises and that gentleman's time was taken up suggesting new expenditures and approving those made; yet he was one of those who criticized the expenditures.

THE BUDGET DEBATE.

Mr. Landry Gives a Convincing Explanation of Himself.

Mr Killam Attempts the Same, and Draws Down Upon Himself a Scouring; and the Provincial Secretary Closes.

It was not for him to say that such an establishment was necessary, but he could not abolish it with a stroke of his pen. It was a costly establishment, and he had tried to keep the expenses down to the lowest point. He had found that gentlemen did not deal with Governments, as a general thing, as they did with each other, and that it cost more to get services performed for a Government than for a private person. He had cut down accounts, and had been found fault with by many for not allowing all that was asked. With the large expenditures made on the buildings, they were in a far better condition than they had been in for years, and it would take a far less sum to maintain them.

Whoever he had found it possible to make a reduction he had done so. When he took office he believed that the contingencies of the office were too large, and had endeavored to cut them down. He had instructed the Chief Clerk, in writing, that an expenditure should be incurred, not ordering, without the signature of the Chief Clerk, and he had kept a record of all expenditures. But, with all this precaution, he found that the expenditures were as large, as was shown by the different reports made, and he had found that there had been very little saving indeed, and had adopted other methods of keeping a check on the office expenses. An order in Council had been passed, directing the Chief Clerk of every department of the Government to make monthly estimates of the stationery required which estimates were to be submitted to the Chief of Department. Purchases were then to be made and the Chief Clerk was to be credited. The Government would be in a position, next session, to say that the expenditure under this head was no larger than was absolutely necessary.

Mr. Landry resumed: He said that on the distribution of the public moneys, it was impossible to please all parties. In some cases more was expended in one place than in another, and while this seemed unfair to the locality receiving the lesser sum, there might be the best of reasons for it.
