Superintendent's Report
Goderich Township.
T. Coleman, Esq. Reeve of Seaford, had thought that he might close the door all more forever after and thus do away with the control of the local municipalities, it might be expected that the \$3000 applied to that purpose would be sufficient. He might state that the improvements undertaken last year had been finished, except the contract on the Seaford and Belmore road, some difficulty between the engineer and the contractor being still unadjusted. He thought that the new tariff of fees would be a relief, nearly every gate-keeper having some forward seeking relief. Whether they should return to the old scale of fees or throw off the gates altogether was for the Council to consider. [Voices.—Throw them off entirely!] It was clear to him that at present worked the gates did not pay for the repairs on the roads. [Hear, hear!] With regard to the proposed new Agricultural Bill, he thought, and Mr. Hays had written to the same effect, that it was not the intention of the Legislature to grant more than \$800.00 to Counties recently divided into ridings. This was a great injustice, and one which should be positioned against by the Council with large Counties such as Perth, Huron, Bruce and Grey should receive only \$300.00, while smaller Counties received quite as much, or more. The main difficulty in the way was that Hon. J. S. McDonald was committed to such a policy of economy that he would not consent to any increase of the appropriation for agricultural purposes, but there was no doubt that by reducing those counties which now received more than their share of Government money, the four municipalities he had named could receive fair play. [Hear, hear.] These four counties had eight representatives and no doubt they would do their best to advance the interests of their constituents in this respect [Applause].
Mr. Perkins said he was sorry to hear the Warden's suggestion that they should go back to the old system of toll gates. The troubles into which the keepers had fallen would be found to grow out of deficiencies in 1866. For his part, he would go for throwing the tolls off altogether. [Applause.] As the Warden had said they were only keeping up a number of families while the few received were not sufficient to keep up the repairs. He would suggest that men be employed at the proper season to fill up the ruts and free the gravel roads of water which did so much to destroy them. [Hear, hear.]
Messrs. Sheppard, Bishop, Sprat, Girvin and Morrow were appointed a committee to draft the standing committees for 1868.
Letter from W. T. Hays Esq. M. P. P. which ran substantially as follows: "Gentlemen: I have the honor to transmit copies of the new Agricultural Bill, and I feel satisfied that a great injustice will be done over large County by reducing the agricultural grant from \$1000 to \$600 dollars. I need not explain at length, as Mr. Gibbons is now present with you, but if you wish your representatives to oppose the measure in this respect, I should like to have your views on the subject as soon as possible."
On motion of Messrs. Sprat and Pollock, H. Hale Esq. was re-appointed Grammar School Trustee of Clinton.
The Council appointed J. Scott Esq. and the Warden appointed W. Mackay as Auditors for the present year.
On motion of Messrs. Pollock and Sprat, P. Adamson Esq. was re-appointed grammar school trustee for Goderich grammar school.
On motion of Messrs. Pollock and Coleman, Councillors Coleman, Girvin, Young, Stoll and Sprat were appointed a committee to examine and report upon the boundary line between the townships of Seaford and Goderich.
The standing rates and regulations of the Council for 1867 were adopted for 1868.
Petition of the Huron Teachers Association was referred to the school committee.
A number of motions for re-appointing Local School Superintendents, referred to the School Committee.
