LONDON, July 31. The Governor, Newfoundland:

During the week we have comple the capture of Pozieres and Delille Wood, and have advanced north of Pozieres. Yesterday, in co-operaion with the French, we advanged on the front from Delville Wood to the olidated last night.

In Verdun the French have made light progress, and the enemy none. In Russia important victories have een gained on the Lutsk salient, and the town of Brody has been captured. The Russian advance continues. Vicory has also been obtained in the direction of Stanislau, Galicia. Pris oners number at least 33,000. A hundred guns were captured. In the Caucasus region Erzingen has been captured, and the Russians are advancing owards Sivas.
