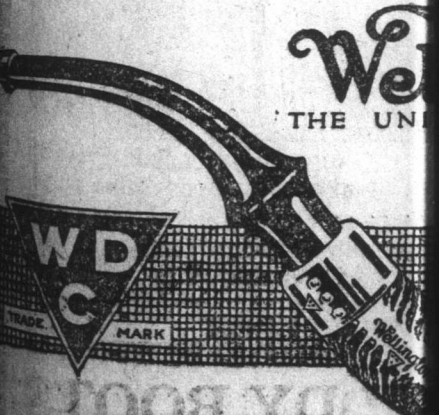

Echoes of J

Let the Truth Be

The German naval critic, Captain
Jelliffe, having told some of the
about the sea fight of Skager-
Jutland from the German point
view, the whole truth should now
out in England as well as in
Canada. The High Seas Fleet has
been shown of most, if not all, of its
ships, and the German Ad-
miralty, or what remains of it as an
organization, might as well reveal its
losses in the battle. No longer will
gun-pow-
der's error
be dis-
puted, but the controversy about Sir
Jelliffe's failure to destroy the
British Fleet should be ended.
The British Admiralty's dis-
missal of its orders to the Admiral
by a statement from him answer-
ing his critics and explaining his
policy.
Captain Persius is reported as say-
ing that the German losses in ships
were enormous. Perhaps in the
evaluation this expression is too
strong. But the High Seas Fleet
could not come out again, except to
be a target. Obviously the official re-
port of losses was mendacious. On
original list were one old battle-
ship, the Pommern; three small
cruisers, the Wiesbaden, Elbing and
Muenster, and five destroyers. Lat-
terly the Admiralty added the battle-
ship Lutzow and the light cruiser
Seydlitz, explaining that "for political
reasons" the names had been with-
drawn. Sir John Jelliffe insisted, up-
on official evidence, that the Germans
lost two dreadnought battle-
ships and a battleship of the Deutsch-
land class, a battle cruiser, five light
cruisers, six destroyers, and one sub-
marine. Further, he maintained that
the dreadnought battleship, one bat-
tleship, and three destroyers were
seriously crippled that they could nev-
er have reached the German base.
Great Britain promptly announced
her losses, extenuating nothing:
two battle cruisers, one of them of
the most powerful type; three ar-
med cruisers, and eight destroyers.
Damage of these vessels was
estimated at 110,000 tons. It has been calculated that
the German Admiral's lowest estimate
of his losses would show a
loss of 110,000 tons. This, if approx-
imately correct, would prove that
the naval disparity of
the two fleets was much harder hit
on June 1.
