Water For School Lavins

Mr. H. A. Smetton, president of the school board, appeared to ask permission of the school trustees to sprinkle school lavins outside the prescribed hours as they have no time during the regular hours. Permission was granted to them to sprinkle between 8 a. m. and 11 a. m. and 3 p. m. and 5 p. m. with the understanding that the school board would have to pay for this privilege it obtained next year.
