In a vast section of North Dakota, bounded by the Red River, the main line of the Northern Pacific, the Devil's Lake region, and the northern limit of the State, men and threshing machines are scarce, and it is estimated that fully 80 per cent. of the wheat crop stands in shocks. To help the farmers save the crop the railroad has offered to transport threshing outfits in carloads at low rates and pass five men free in charge of each carload.

Both vessels left Astoria on April 8; but this time one sail d for Dunkirk and the other for Havre.
