> Inasmuch as the text of the German admiralty's proclamation had not ar rived no conclusions were reached and no general opinion developed as to what diplomatic steps should be taken by the United States Government. Should

the communication fall to arrive by tomorrow Acting Secretary Lansing will direct Ambassador Gerard at Berlin to make the customary inquiry at the German foreign office as to the authenticity of a published report.

If the German proclamation, when officially transmitted, corresponds in phraseology to the report which came by wireless yesterday, it was suggested in executive quarters that the course of the American Government probably would be the interest of the Course of the American Government probably would be to inquire, first, of the German Government what measures of protection or convoy can be expected by American merchant ships passing through the designated war zones to the neutral ports, and, second, of the British Government as to whether or not it has issued the alleged secret order permitting the use of neutral flags by her merchantmen. A denial by Great Britain of the existence of the order would be followed, it is understood, by inquiry of the German authorities as to proof of their charge. The suggestion that economy, asserting that the nation was neutral flags were being misused caused no little concern among high officials, in no more danger of war now than who said they had heard no reports of it before.




