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Magnificence of Exhibit Told by Lowrie Warren, Native of Sarnia.

### MASTERFUL WORK

Talented Young Painter Now Continuing His Studies in Antwerp.

Canadian art found a warmth of appreciation from visitors to the Wembley exhibition. In that city of magnificent buildings, displaying the wealth of treasures of the world, brought together from the furthermost parts of the British empire, the art exhibit of Canada enjoyed with rich color and strong design.

Lowrie Warren of Sarnia, talented young painter, who has just completed three years at the Ontario college of art, Toronto, coupled with outdoor sketching in Northern Ontario, found the British warm in their praise of the masterful work of the Canadian painter.

The paintings were the delight of all who saw them. The impression gathered by Mr. Warren, Europeans greeted the broad treatment and lavish color effect of the pictures as evidence of a lack of restraint which could be arrived at only in a new country, alive with possibilities and freedom unchecked by the conservatism of the old world.

The pictures were a direct contrast to the canvases of the European masters. The brilliant works appeared even more subdued in the light of Canadian technique. The English galleries, including the Tate, the National Gallery, and the Wallace Collection, were crowded with the works of the modernists who, in view of the impression and priceless collections of the visitors.

Following his visit to the British galleries, Mr. Warren went to France. It was his intention to proceed to Munich to study. He aimed to spend a short time in Belgium before going on to Bavaria, but Antwerp claimed him. One trip to the galleries and the schools of that city captured him. He is studying at the Academie Royale des Beaux Arts.

Art Students Welcomed. Europe is a wonderful country for students of art, says Mr. Warren. They receive generous treatment from the government, and are not over-heated. "Modern conveniences" is a phrase unknown in Bohemian circles abroad.

In the cafes, where students meet over their meals, the fare is generously supplied. Even the restaurants have a genuine regard for the artists. In one place Mr. Warren saw a picture of Varley, the noted Canadian artist. The proprietor said he cherished the picture of a former student who was once there.

George D. Penner and Walter E. Baetz of the Ontario college of art, are also studying abroad this year.

Associated Press Despatch. London, Dec. 5.—Sterling exchange closed last night at \$48.11-12, with a strong tone, forward business being done at an even slightly higher quotation than spot business. This is the highest mark reached since March, 1923.

The financial editor of the Morning Post says the impression prevails in the market that the influences operating to raise exchange are financial rather than commercial.

So far, visible imports and exports are concerned, the movement might actually be downward, but several influences, some of them perhaps sentimental in character, have swayed American capital toward Europe in recent months, and the volume of American money on deposit in England at the present moment seems unusually large, while in some departments of the stock exchange a certain amount of the present buying is evidently for American accounts.

VICTIM IMPROVED. Philip Griswold, of Melbourne, who had his hand badly mangled while operating a circular saw in that village a few days ago, is reported to be slightly improved at Victoria hospital, where he underwent an operation. The tendons of his wrist are severed, and it is believed he may lose the use of his hand.

## POLICY OF SOVIET BEING SIMPLIFIED

Radical Changes Being Made to Bolster Up Economic Structure.

Associated Press Despatch. Moscow, Dec. 5.—The Soviet economic policy appears to be undergoing gradual modifications. The government of late has adopted a much more lenient attitude toward private trading, private capital, foreign imports and concessions.

The change of tactics to bolster up the Soviet economic structure, received official emphasis yesterday, when Felix Dzerjinsky, head of the supreme economic council, declared at a meeting of the council that Soviet legislation and communist party instructions had gone too far in suppressing private capital.

The speaker urged the reintroduction of private trade, a less drastic policy toward foreign imports, and also stressed the desirability of granting concessions to foreigners.

The government's previous attitude toward private trade, which he stated, had promoted the capital for production purposes and investment in the country.

The speaker stated that the government had decided to withdraw its capital from trade and replace it with private capital.

The return of the Conservatives in England, and the all-round endeavor in Europe to balance budgets were given as reasons for expecting a brighter financial and commercial condition in that market.

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## Storm King Holds Sway In West

Associated Press Despatch. Omaha, Neb., Dec. 5.—A blizzard, the first of the season, which held Nebraska in the grip of the storm king yesterday, following a calm and sleet storm this week, brought in one known death, considerable damage throughout the state.

Equipment to the value of \$33,600 will be purchased almost immediately by the public utilities commission for the new substation on Carling street.

Plans Now Being Made To Equip New Carling Street Substation.

Plans submitted to the commission yesterday by Manager E. V. Buchanan were approved and the purchase of the equipment left to the chairman, Jared Vining, and the general manager.

Mr. Buchanan pointed out that the equipment for the substation was necessary originally, but the station is to be equipped as the initial station of the "ring main" system, which is a proposed extension throughout the city within the next few years.

The "ring main" system embraces the improvement of the system by means of heavy feeders, which in case of any dislocation in the system will enable the stations on either side of the interruption to automatically clear themselves and thus maintain the system uninterrupted.

The new equipment will permit of the present load on the Horton street station being largely transferred to the Carling street station, which will have a load of approximately 10,000 kva. It is immediately installation of the equipment is completed.

It is expected that the equipment, which is to be purchased from Canadian Westinghouse Company, Limited, will be installed in the new station ready for use by the end of March.

The cost of the equipment will be met by the commission partly out of \$10,000 debentures recently issued for that express purpose, and the balance from the general debenture issue for purposes of extensions and improvements in the system.

The commission still has approximately \$40,000 on hand from the \$200,000 secured at the beginning of the year for such purposes.

In commenting upon the purchase of the equipment as being "good business," Mr. Vining pointed out that the station would be a member of the commission.

"And that will have to be this year," said Mr. Vining.

HAIR NETS REMOUELLED TO SUIT VOGUE IN 'BOBS'

Firm Officials Now Strive To Meet Situation—Style Still Popular.

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An investigation of the barber shops of London, however, shows no diminution in the demand for bobbed hair. Such a wave of reaction is now remodelling its premises to provide privacy for its clientele.
