

LABOR TO PUSH FASCIST PROBE

British Party Claims Men Are

**Freed Through Government's
Dislike of Labor Paper.**

London, Nov. 16.—The usual crowd

of members of parliament gathered in the house of commons early this morning in preparation for the short session which is to resume the work left unfinished when adjournment was taken in August. The public is not showing any special interest in the session, which is expected to last five or six weeks, although opposition politicians and the political writers have been laying stress on the dangers of tariff proposals and other government measures. The short session, especially, seems determined to give the government a lively time. They are making a great deal of capital out of the manner in which the case of the miners has been treated, and an issue of the Herald-Laborite organ, was handled

The case against the men was dropped and the Laborites assert that the public prosecutor, on behalf of the government, so framed the indictment as to insure that they would escape punishment, because the Herald is noted by the government.

The Liberals are expected to support the Laborites on this issue, and it is thought a strong effort will be made to discredit Premier Baldwin's government. The case has been adversely commented on by some of the government papers.
