RACE BALL.  
THE PRESIDENT'S STATEMENT.  
President Cal Davis, of the Canadian League, makes the following statement regarding the position of affairs respecting St. Thomas: "A crisis was reached in the affairs of the Canadian League when the St. Thomas club was deliberately selling under false colors all season.
