The Mayor suggested that the snow be
earted away instead of thrown aside, whereupon the Senator, declared he would rather
gtop cars and busses and let the horses ent
their heads eff in the stables than part

Frank retired and the City Solicitor was instructed to look into the case and report on the law. There seems to be an ambiguity in the charter, which provides that the snow shall be removed, but does not say where it shall be placed.

In the afternoon the Mayor, speaking to The World, remarked that as the local improve-ment plan for the eleaning of streets came into force on Jan. I the merchants will naturally object to pay for the removal of snow thrown in front of their shops by the Street Railway Company.


