Thirty-five inventors and patentees met in Room I, Temperance Hall, last evening to adopt some concerted action to have amended the laws relating to patents of invention. Mr. John Galt, C.E., occupied the chair.

The principal grievance complained of by those present was the regulation compelling inventors to send models to the patent office, involving heavy expense. One case was cited where it cost \$1000 to prepare a model of an article which manufactured sold at 40 cents. It was pointed out that Canada was the only country requiring the furnishing of models and that the submitting of models and that the submitting of the drawings would not only be adequate, but would abolish the extra tax on the inventive genius of the country. There was also a pronounced feeling among the members of extending the duration of patents, and of a reduction in the Government fee for the five-year period. One member stated that \$2.5 was saked for copies of patent papers, which should not cost more than 25 cents.


