THE DISASTER ON LAKE NIPISING.

Twenty Lives Were Lost by the Bursting of the Ice—List of the Dead and Drowned.

NORTH BAY, Ont., Nov. 8.—While the steamer John Fraser was on a route from Collingwood to Davidson Bay & Co.'s lumber camp on the western end of Lake Nipissing, a fire broke out, burning the boat to the water's edge, causing the loss of 20 men.

Seven men all were saved. Cause of fire unknown. Life boat was found drifting with a hole in one side.

Ballroom Collision on the Rock Island at Chicago.

CHICAGO, Nov. 8.—By a rear end collision on the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad this evening at Seventy-first street five people were killed and 11 were injured.
