BOSANQUET COUNCIL.

Council met on the 3rd inst; members all present; the following orders were given: Wm. Campbell, \$6.67 sheep killed; Robt. Call \$7, seven sheep worried; Wm. Valentine, \$8, 4 sheep worried; Sidney Tickner \$4, a lamb killed; Caleb Travis \$3.85 a lamb killed; James Lawrie, T. A. Bell, Duncan McIntyre, James South and John Way, \$1 each for inspecting sheep; John Govenlock, \$24.60, for gravel; Wm. Anderson, \$5.10 for gravel; John Way \$2.30, for gravel; Albert Wight 70¢, for gravel; Wm. Bailly \$100, for gravel; Wesley Lucas \$110, for gravel; John Beer \$5, gravel; B. Rawlings \$23.50, gravel; D. A. Taylor \$3.75, gravel; Wm. Jennings \$3.50, Sam Burr \$2.25, and Fred Dew 75¢, assisting engineer, etc., on Hanev Drain; Wm. Brown \$3, necessities for Mrs. Kilmerry; John Cornell \$1, necessities for Mrs. Merian; Archie Jamieson \$1.75 putting tongue into road grader; Byron McIntyre \$5, causing to be killed two dogs, worrying sheep; David Sheppard \$2.50, ditching on 21 sideroad; Wm. Paisley \$3.75 ditching on 6th con.; W. N. Ironside treasurer of Thorford, \$32.50, Bosanquet share building bridge on 21 sideroad; Wm. Wiler \$1.50 ditching con. 6; the county treasurer \$183, keep of inmates at House of Refuge (Mrs. Hicks 182 days, Dennis Waters 365 days, Andrew Robson 185 days, and John Robson 122 days); the clerk \$17 to pay legal expenses; Dr. Grant \$9, services in connection with the Board of Health; Mrs. Haselwood, Albert Romph, Andrew Bell and Edward Culley, \$1 each, refund dog tax. The referee was authorized to look into the grievance of Wm. J. Travis with power to act. The Councils law by law was finally passed by the referee and Mr. Fraser were appointed commissioners. The Reeve of Plympton served on the Reeve of Bosanquet a copy of the engineer's report, etc. for the report of the Councils drain on the south side of the townline, Plympton and Bosanquet, which on motion was accepted. A. S. Code was appointed township engineer, King Edward Hall in Thorford, was appointed as the place for holding the nominations for the ensuing municipal elections with the same deputy returning officers and polling places of last year.

Mr. Porte gave notice that he has been authorized by A. Duffus and H. A. Jones to commence an action against the township to recover damages for water improperly taken into the Duffus drain by the Walden and Lushy drains without provision being made for an outlet for the same, thereby flooding his clients' lands so that they have been unable to derive any benefit from their crop and the clerk was instructed to notify one engineer to examine the drain and carry it to a proper outlet as soon as possible.

Council adjourned to meet on Saturday the 15th inst., at 10 a. m.

The court of revision on the Councils drain confirmed the engineer's assessment.

NOTICE.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that an application will be made to the Parliament of Canada, at its next session, for an Act to incorporate a company under the name of "The St. Joseph Transportation Company" with power to locate and construct a canal or system of canals, so as to create a navigable waterway from some point on the eastern shore of Lake Huron, in the County of Huron or of La-Union, in the said province, with power to make surveys and to determine the location of the said waterway; to dredge, deepen, raise or lower, the levels of, or improve the existing water-courses between the said points, and to establish such connecting links necessary to make and complete throughout the entire distance between the said terminal points, a navigable canal of a depth of not less than eighteen feet, and of a width which may be found necessary to enable vessels of deep draft to meet and pass in safety at any point in said canal; moreover, to construct, operate and maintain all such works and structures necessary in connection with such through waterway; moreover, to acquire, build, own, lease, operate and maintain or otherwise dispose of terminals, harbours, wharves, docks, piers, landing places, water lots, yards, elevators, warehouses, dry docks, reservoirs, and other structures, such as locks, dams and all works necessary for the production and use of electric, hydraulic, pneumatic and other power required for the said undertaking; and also for the purpose of irrigation; to lease or otherwise dispose of said works and power; to acquire, own, transport by cable or electric power, all steamers, barges, or any other vessels which require to be transported through the said waterway for the purpose of said navigation, and also with power to acquire, own, sell and dispose of and operate vessels of all kinds, and to transport them through the said canal, in such manner and upon such terms as the company may deem fit; with power also to acquire by purchase, expropriation or otherwise, such lands, water lots, rights in navigable or unnavigable streams and rivers and other such property as may be necessary for the purpose of the undertaking; and to again dispose thereof or any part thereof as the company may deem expedient; to levy and to collect tolls; to take, use and dispose of water for the purpose of said canal or for irrigation purposes or for generating hydraulic and other powers; to transmit and dispose of the said powers for all purposes, with power also to construct and operate a line of railway and tramway of either standard or narrow gauge; also such bridges, ferries, telegraph, telephone or electric light or power lines, which may be considered necessary in connection with the said undertaking; to own, acquire, control and operate branch lines of railway to connect with all and any railways situated within a distance of ten miles from any portion of the said canal, and with respect thereto, with power to acquire lands and property necessary for such branch lines by expropriation under the Railway Act, and to connect with such other railway or railways and enter into running or traffic arrangements therewith; also to acquire and run said branch lines of railway either by steam or electric or cable or pneumatic power; to make arrangements with any company, corporation, person or persons whomsoever to carry passengers, freight or other commodity over and through the works of the company, and to charge such prices and tolls therefor as may be approved; moreover, with power to purchase or otherwise acquire shares, debentures and securities of other canal or railway companies and corporations, and to sell or exchange its own securities with such companies; and to carry on transportation, forwarding and elevator business for the purpose of the undertaking; together with all such other general powers and privileges, including financing, as may be necessary for the purpose hereinabove more particularly described.
