## WHAT IT STANDS FOR

***The total and final abolition of the bar and public drinking places.***

A demand for Government control exercised with a view to the elimination of the abuse, without undue interference with that temperate use of alcoholic beverages which is characteristic of the people of this Dominion.

All legislation for the general good which does not unduly interfere with the private life and habits of the individual citizen.

The safeguarding of those rights and liberties of the individual which are of the solid foundation of the British Empire.

## What It Opposes

All legislation, Dominion or Provincial, which tends to unduly curtail the individual rights and liberties of the citizen.

The tyranny of a highly organized minority over an unorganized majority through legislation affected by agitation and propaganda.

## The Facts

The question submitted in the Referendum, to be voted on April 18th, was framed by the well organized minority, the Prohibitionists, and was purposely worded so as NOT to give the people of this Province a chance to voice their true sentiments.

Any legislation based on such a Referendum would therefore be violation of personal liberty.

Personal liberty is not a question for a Referendum.

## It is an Inherent Natural Right

Interference with strictly personal affairs is unbearable to a free people. The exercise of such authority by a majority would be **intolerable tyranny**, but the assumption of such power by an ill-informed and bigoted **minority** is **colossal impudence**, which should be resented.

Personal liberty is the right to do as one pleases in sacredly private affairs. The choice of occupation, religion, food, drink, clothing—these are matters of personal liberty.

Prohibition is unethical and a plain violation of personal liberty.
