How to MAKE GRAHAM BREAD.—Graham bread that can be started at breakfast and baked before dinner is made of one pint and a half of sour milk, two scant teaspoonfuls of soda dissolved in a little hot water, half a cup of New Orleans molasses, a teaspoonful of salt and as much Graham flour as can be stirred with a spoon. Grease a large bread tin very evenly as the molasses in the bread renders it liable to stick, put it into the oven and bake for two hours. Have the oven hot when the bread is put in, and toward the last half hour let it cool gradually. Or this bread may be steamed for one hour and three quarters and dried off in the oven twenty minutes. When it is taken from the oven wrap a towel around the loaf, the tin and all, and keep the loaf wrapped in the cloth until it is sent to the table.

PLAIN OMELET.—Use six eggs; separate the whites from the yolks, and beat them one to a stiff froth; beat the yolks with one of milk, one table-spoonful of melted butter, and three or four dessertspoonfuls of flour, with a little of the milk; add a teaspoonful of salt and the beaten whites just before frying. This quantity will make two good-sized omelets, and will be cooked more conveniently than one large one. Have the frying pan hot, and drop in a scant teaspoonful of butter, and let it melt and cover the surface of the pan evenly; then pour in half the above mixture, and let it cook raising it with a knife or griddle-cake lifter, so that it will not scorch or brown too quickly. When of a light brown underneath and soft above roll it up as carefully as possible, after the manner of a jelly-cake, and turn it upon a hot platter. From three to five minutes is plenty of time to cook it. This is hearty, and the quantity is sufficient for five or six persons.

ALMOND CAKE.—The following recipe for almond cake is a good one; it makes a very nice cake for the breakfast.—Take one cup of butter, one cup and a half of sugar, three eggs, half a cup of milk, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, about two cups of flour; flour with a little almond extract. Blanch one pound of almonds; lay aside enough to cover the top of the cake when they are out in halves; chop the rest, and put into the cake. After the cake is in the tin, lay the split ones over the top of the cake; they will rise and brown as the cake bakes. This is delicious! Try it!
