CONSTITUTION.

I.

NAME.—This Association shall be called "The Halifax Medical Society."

II.

Objects.—The objects of the Society shall be:—the advancement of Medical Science; the discussion of all subjects pertaining to the profession; and the protection of the rights of its members.

III.

MEMBERS.—All legally qualified regular practitioners in Medicine and Surgery of good moral standing in the county of Halifax, shall be eligible as members of this Society.

IV

Officers.—The officers of the Society shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and a Council of five members, one of which shall be the Secretary.

V.

PRESIDENT.—The President shall preside at all meetings of the Society; enforce a strict observance of the Constitution and Bye-Laws; call special meetings; sign all orders for monies to be paid by the Treasurer; with the Secretary examine qualifications of candidates for membership; and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him.

Note:—At the Annual Meeting it is expected that the retiring President will deliver an address, which shall refer more particularly to the advance made in the Science of Medicine during the past year.

VI.

VICE-PRESIDENT.—In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall perform his duties.
