REV. WILLIAM ARTHUR .-- It is reported that the Rev. William Arthur has recently receive a legacy of two hundred thousand dollars, at faithfully carrying out his principles cerning the duty of Christians giving a stated amount of their income to the cause of benevolence, he has given five thousand dollars to the British and Foreign Bible Society, fifteen thousand do'lars to the Wesleyan Metropolitan Chapel Building Fund, and five thousand dollars to the Wesleyan Missionary Society; making in all twenty-five thousand dollars.

THE BIBLE MOVEMENT AMONG THE REGI-MENTS .-- The principal business of the New York Bible Society, for some time past, has been, by the Committee on Posts and Naval Stations, in supplying those occupying them with copies of the New Testament. These operations have been very active to the marines of the Navy Yard, and the men on board our naval ships, as also to the soldiers at the forts. Twenty-one of the volunteer regiments which have left this city, or are now stationed in it, have received for each man a copy of the New Testament. These are neatly bound, and on the inside of the cover of each is an appropriate colored design, exhibiting the Stars and Stripes, and below it the inscription, "To the detenders of our country-presented by the New York Bible Society."
