In our last lesson we saw Jesus led from the preliminary trial before Annas to be tried before the Sanbelrim, of which Caiaphas, as high priest, was president. The trial resulted in His being condemned and handed over to the mob (Matt. 26: 57-68). The night trial, however, was illegal and so a morning session was held to pass sentence upon Him (Matt. 27: 1; Luke 22: 66-71). It then remained to gain the consent of Pilate, as the Roman Governor, to put Him to death; and here our present lesson begins.
