

WAGHORN'S GUIDE.

No person shall at any time offer for sale, barter or exchange, any Prairie Chicken that has been, caught or, killed by any person other than himself.

Non-residents of the N. W. T. require a license from the Commissioner of Agriculture at Regina (fee \$15) to hunt or shoot. Licenses cover period from Aug. 1 to Dec. 31 annually, but do not give right to hunt or shoot until the expiration of two weeks after protected animals or birds may lawfully be hunted or killed by residents of the Territories.

The possession of any dead animals, or birds, or parts (except skins lawfully taken), is prohibited during Close Season. But any animal or bird lawfully taken at other times can be bought or sold.

Game guardians can seize birds or animals illegally in possession and bring offenders before a Justice of the Peace within 3 months of offense. Fine—Buffalo \$100; other game \$50 or 2 months.

The export or carrying out of the N. W. T. of Grouse, Partridge, Pheasant, Prairie Chicken, Elk, Moose, Cariboo, Antelope, or their Fawn, is prohibited.

FISH LAWS—ONTARIO.—Close Season.

Bass, Muskinonge, (Rice Lake, 1 June) 15th April to 15th June.

Pickeral (Doro) 15th April to 15th May.

Trout, speckled, 15 Sept. to 1 May.

Salmon Trout, 1st to 30th Nov.

Whitefish, 1st to 30th Nov.

Both days

inclusive in each case.

FISH LAWS OF MANITOBA AND N. W. T.

Commercial licenses granted in northern parts of Lake Winnipeg only, 20,000 yards of 5 in. gill net only allowed each person or firm. Close season for such 1st of Sept. to 1st May. Person or firm must be British subjects and bona fide owners of plant.

Domestic licenses—settlers, residents, half breed Indians, 500 yard gill net in all lakes of Manitoba, for whitefish mesh 5 in. extensive measure, for pike, pickerel, etc., 4 in. ex measure.

Close season—For Whitefish, 5th Oct. to 1st Dec. on all lakes in Manitoba.

Lake Winnipegosis—Winter fishing licenses from January 1st to March 31st. 300 yards of net to each license. Number restricted to 100.

Pike, Pickerel (or Doro) Maskinonge Mullet and other spring spawning species, except Sturgeon 15th April to 15th May. Sturgeon, May 15 to June 15. Sturgeon licenses 300 yds. 11 in. extn. measure.

Fishing without license prohibited. Nets not to be used within 1/4 mile of mouth or outlet of any river. Bag nets, trap nets, or fish-pound illegal. Lime, chemicals, oil, sawdust, or any deleterious substances prohibited in waters. The use of explosives, spears, fire arms, &c., illegal. Special licenses to Indians for food fishing.

Nets must be raised and all fishing stopped between 6 p.m. on Saturdays and 6 a.m. on Mondays.
