• FRUITS CONSISTING OF CARPELS ONLY.

edges of the carpillary leaves only meeting, leaving the fruit one-celled, with parietal placenta.....

edges of carpillary leaves meeting at the axis, being infolded and adherent, forming double partitions: placenta axillary

fruit indehiscent: the carpels forming by their coherence a bag open at the apex.....

dehiscent..... { on the middle line of each carpel..... *Ez.* Reseda.

by pores under stigmatic rays..... *Ez.* Viola.

adherence slight: dehiscence by separation of the carpels (Serpentaria)..... *Ez.* Papaver.

dehiscence by circumscission..... *Ez.* Colchicum.

dehiscence by the midribs of the carpillary leaves, i.e. vertically down the middle of each (Loculicidaria)..... *Ez.* Tulip.

dehiscence as in the last, but the valves formed by the united halves of two carpels breaking from the infolded partitions which are united at the axis (Serruriacal)..... *Ez.* Morning Glory.

fruit indehiscent—pulpy—a berry..... *Ez.* Solanum.

edges of the carpillary leaves infolded to the axis, and again projecting into the cell, the placenta forming a round or lengthened enlargement within each cell.....

placentation *free central*, perhaps from the absorption of the parts of the carpillary leaves forming the partitions, or from the base only of each carpel producing placenta { by circumsision.....

two, three, or more carpels only perfecting one seed.....

many achenia on a hollow torus, having an un-shaped synsepalous calyx, which finally becomes pulpy..... *Ez.* Rosa.

Ez. Strawberry.

many achenia on the surface of a fleshy torus..... *Ez.* Clematis, Potentilla.

Ez. Brambleberry.

many small drupes united round a knobbed torus..... *Ez.* Asclepias.

Ez. Brambleberry.

a single circle of carpels adhering by their outer edge to the torus—the whole forming a fleshy fruit..... *Ez.* Nellumbium.

Ez. Apple.

numerous carpels crowded on an elongated receptacle..... *Ez.* Magnolia.

Ez. Magnolia.

numerous carpels separately half imbedded in a common fleshy receptacle..... *Ez.* Euphorbia, Dictamnus.

Ez. Nellumbium.

epicarps generally separating at maturity: lobes of the fruit bursting { *Ez.* Reseda, *Ez.* Bupleurum.

Ez. Tropaeolum, Alis-

epicarps not separable: lobes dividing without elasticity..... *Ez.* Dianthus.

Ez. Linum.

two carpels each producing one seed from each side, forming four indehiscent nuts, like naked seeds: each lobe a..... *Ez.* Nutagartia, Borago, Linum.

any of the single ones occurring cases in one or more circles.....

pair of follicles..... *Ez.* Asclepias.
