

Boors, SHOES, AND LEATHER.—A pretty gen-eral air of quietude prevails in these lines, though we hear of one or two of the shoe factories, trying to keep as many of their hands at work as they can. In leather no activity is looked for till after Old Xmas or Epiphany, to which period many of the shoe-operatives continue their revels. Leather stocks are full, but not unduly accumulated. Further advice sfrom England report a con-tinued fair demand, but as yet no appreciation in values.
