THIS IS YET ANOTHER MARK OF THE GOOD STATE OF CANADA-U.S.
RELATIONS, FOR IN TO-DAY'S TROUBLED ECONOMIC TIMES,
COUNTRIES USUALLY MOVE INSTINCTIVELY TOWARDS ISOLATION,
PROTECTION AND CONFRONTATION.

No one speech can cover the full range of Canada-United States relations. Even if it could, we can be certain that before the words were uttered, new elements would be added and other no longer relevent issues deleted. Such is the nature of one of the most complex and dynamic bilateral associations in the world.

DESPITE THIS EVER-CHANGING PATTERN THERE ARE,
NEVERTHELESS, CERTAIN CONSTANTS IN THE RELATIONSHIP, MOST
OF THEM HIGHLY DESIRABLE AND POSITIVE BUT A FEW, AS WE
