THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL N¹⁴.

An Act for the relief of Pearl Marie Neil Lane.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Pearl Marie Neil Lane, residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, clerk, wife of Ronald Edward Lane, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the said city, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the third day of January, A.D. 1939, 5 at the city of Halifax, in the province of Nova Scotia, she then being Pearl Marie Neil, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence 10 adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

Right to marry again. 1. The said marriage between Pearl Marie Neil and 15 Ronald Edward Lane, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

2. The said Pearl Marie Neil may at any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said 20 marriage with the said Ronald Edward Lane had not been solemnized.
