THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL A⁸.

An Act for the relief of Dorothy May Tucker Patterson.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Dorothy May Tucker Patterson, residing at Wheathampstead, in the county of Herts, England, wife of Alvin Albert Patterson, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, has by her petition alleged that they were married 5 on the twenty-fourth day of April, A.D. 1943, at Wheathampstead aforesaid, she then being Dorothy May Tucker, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and 10 adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it it expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:-15

Marriage dissolved.

Right to marry again. 1. The said marriage between Dorothy May Tucker and Alvin Albert Patterson, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

2. The said Dorothy May Tucker may at any time 20 hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Alvin Albert Patterson had not been solemnized.
