**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-
WEST LAND REGULATIONS**

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, or under certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader, or by a tutor or guardian's residence.

INVESTMENT OF FUNDS
