Sir Cosmo and Lady Duff-Gordon Stick Firmly To Their Denials

Many Society Women Listen With Intense Interest to Evidence—Lord Marley Reproves Attorney Who Asked Knight Pointed Question—Incident Declared Closed.

LONDON, May 20.—(Can. Press.)—The board of trade enquiry into the Titanic disaster has taken on more of the character of a society function than that of an investigation into the circumstances of a great catastrophe. Those who did not possess special tickets stood on chairs at the back of the hall craning their necks so as to obtain a view of the chief actors connected with the incident of the partly filled lifeboat, which saved Sir Cosmo and Lady Duff-Gordon and Lady Duff.

Clash in Stories.

The former said that both women and men rushed to the boats, while Gordon insisted that his story that he had been waiting on the deck for some time before asking permission to enter a boat, was correct.

Attorney Edwards proceeded to ask: "The possibility of offering help to people in the water was never thought of?" Gordon admitted this.

Attorney Edwards: It was more important to think of offering a present of 15 than to think of going to the rescue of the drowning?" Gordon, who lost his temper, was finally relieved of this unfriendly cross-examination, and under the direction of Attorney Dukes, went over his story of the incidents, which is new familiar.

Wife Corroborates.

Lady Duff-Gordon was then called to give testimony. This closed the evidence in regard to the much-discussed lifeboat, and the examination of the crew of the Titanic was resumed.

No Friction 'Twixt France and Russia

PARIS, May 20.—(Can. Press.)—An inspired despatch from St. Petersburg to The Temps, denies in the most categorical form the insinuation that there is a divergence of views between France and Russia. Russia, according to the despatch, is anxious to bring the Russo-Italian war to an end, as it is causing immense losses to Russian shipping. Nevertheless the Russian Government does not harbor the slightest design against Turkey, nor is it exercising pressure on Turkey.

Russia is likewise anxious to preserve the existing condition of things in the Balkans, for which purpose it has reached understandings with Austria and Italy. These understandings are not inimical to France, which Russia hopes will not be influenced by the attempts of schemers to destroy the solid Franco-Russian alliance.

Balkans, for which purpose it has reached understandings with Austria and Italy. These understandings are not inimical to France, which Russia hopes will not be influenced by the attempts of schemers to destroy the solid Franco-Russian alliance.
