Mutualization of Equitable on New Basis of Representation and Four Retirements Are Necessary.

New York, April 2. - James Hazen Hyde won a decisive victory yesterday and in the fight made against him by the forces representative of the opposing interests of J. W. Alexander, when it was decided to mutualize the Equitable Life Assurance Society upon the lines suggested by Mr. Hyde, namely, that the policyholders be given representation in the direction of the affairs of the company at a ratio of 28 to 24.

This agreement was made after a meeting lasting more than five hours in the office of the superintendent of insurance, at No. 11 Broadway. It was agreed by Mr. Hyde and Elihu

Root, of counsel for the society, that

Root, of counsel for the society, that the policy-holders should have at once two directors in the board to fill the vacancies existing there. It was also agreed that the policy-holders should have at once four memberships in the executive committee.

In order to accomplish the latter it will be necessary that four of the present committee be relieved of their duties. The superintendent of insurance was designated as the man to select those who shall retire from the committee.

Two of the committeemen will be named by the Crimmins policy-holders' committee, and the other two by Cornelius N. Bliss.

Within Two Years.

Mr. Root, in behalf of Mr. Hyde and the board of directors of the society, accepted the plan and the work will now be begun to carry it out.


