THE SOARER AT AINTREE.

RANK OUTSIDER CAPTURES THE GRAND NATIONAL.

You Could Have Had 66 to 1 About Him at One Time in the Books—Father O'Flynn Was Second and Biscuit Third—Rory O'More Was the Favorite at 7 to 1—There Were 27 Starters.

Liverpool, March 27.—The Grand National Steeplechase of four miles 800 yards was run today through the steeplechase field, and was won by The Soarer, on whom about 27 to 1 could be had early in the day. Father O'Flynn, the winner in 1892, and a handicap for 4-year-olds. The Soarer, a 25 to 1 shot, was second, and Biscuit, a 25 to 1 shot, was third. Why Not, who won in 1894, was nowhere. There were 27 starters.

The Grand National Steeplechase of 2000 yards (inclusive of a trophy of the value of £100) was run at Aintree on Saturday, March 27. The Soarer, owned by Mr. C. G. M. Campbell & Co., was the favorite at 27 to 1. He was followed by Father O'Flynn, the winner in 1892, and a handicap for 4-year-olds. The Soarer, a 25 to 1 shot, was second, and Biscuit, a 25 to 1 shot, was third. Why Not, who won in 1894, was nowhere. There were 27 starters.

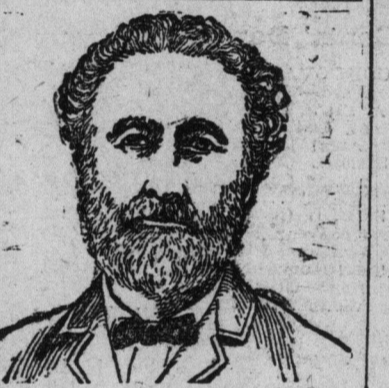
Looks Like Cambridge.
