A bylaw was introduced to reduce the commission charged for buying by a refund of 75c per car under certain conditions to old members on this year's purchases, making net commission \$1.25 for Ontario and \$1.75 for Manitoba wheat.

The following resolution was carried: "That on and after July 1, 1899, a rebate of 75c per car be allowed to each member on the commission chargeable under the bylaws of the Association, who purchased wheat through the central wheat buyer's office prior to July 1, 1893, and who shall purchase wheat through the said office at such rates to be allowed on as many loads as were purchased by such members as shall equalize the number of carloads purchased by them prior to July 1, 1893, and which may not have been credited to him."

The retiring president, Mr. S. R. Stuart, Mitchell, Ont., said a few words.

Mr. Hedley Shaw in a paper advocated the appointment of a solicitor in Quebec and other eastern provinces as a protection for millers who are last in making their sales. He suggested that a committee be appointed to select a solicitor in Ontario and the eastern provinces, and that all complaints be forwarded to the secretary, who would inquire into the circumstances with the purchaser. He thought that if the merchants knew they had to fight the whole association, and not one single member, they would probably think twice before refusing flour without good grounds.






