

(1) Having voted once and not being entitled to vote again at an election, ap-ply at the same election for a ballot, paper in his own name, or advise, or abet, counsel or procure any other per-son so to do,
2. No person shall attempt to commit any offense specified in this section.
3. A person guilty of any violation of this section shall be liable, if he is the clerk of the municipality, to imprisonment for any term not exceeding two years, with or without hard labor; and, if he is any other person, to imprisonment for a term not ex-ceeding six months, with or without hard labor.
