WAR NOTES.

Tokio, May 5.—A telegram has been received here from Gen. Kuroki, dated May 3, in which he reports that a careful search of the battlefield of last Sunday revealed two hundred additional wounded and dead Russians. He expects that a complete search of the field will result in increasing this number.

LEFT FORTUNES.

Brockville Man to Get \$300,000—Gananogue Family Lucky.

Brockville, May 5.—(Special)—A cablegram from Edinburgh, Scotland, just received by W. J. Douglas, proprietor of the Hotel Strathcona, of this town, announces the death of his uncle, Charles Montgomery Douglas, a very wealthy manufacturer, who was unmarried. Deceased was his 60th year and had always made his home in the Old Country. A conservative estimate of his wealth places it at \$300,000, and the only heirs are two nephews and one niece.

One of the lucky nephews is Mr. Douglas of Brockville, who expects to receive the biggest portion of the estate. He had made arrangements to sail for Scotland to-day to claim his "share" when other plans presented themselves by which the matter will be left in the hands of an attorney.

Mr. Douglas is a cripple, and the fortune which comes to him, estimated at \$200,000, will be quite a bonanza.

TILLSONBURG TEACHER APPOINTED
