NOW WANTS HER MONEY**

Mr. Sophie B. Johnston is bringing an action in the non-jury assizes against Oscar Wade, assignee of the Poole Publishing Company, in which she claims that she is entitled to a charge of lien upon all the assets of the company to secure her the repayment of a loan of \$3000, made in September 1904, to the company, and which was secured by \$500 gold bonds, valued at \$4500. Mrs. Johnston wants the property sold, subject to her rights. Her husband, as the secretary of the company, asked her for the loan.

The \$3000, it was stated by Mr. Johnston, went to the Dominion Express Company, for which the company was an agent.
