# 'LIFE" FOR GEO, SLACK

Justice Anglin, Viewing Him as Incorrigible, Imposes Extreme Penalty.

Justice Anglin yesterday, in the criminal assizes, sentenced George Slack to life imprisonment. crime for which Slack is to pay the crime for which Slack is to pay the penalty was a particularly brutal one. The victim was Mrs. Davies, a woman of advanced years, who keeps a small store at Yonge and Gloucesterstreets. On March 20 last a man entered her store and brutally assaulted her, getting away with some \$20 from the till. She, together with several other witnesses, positively identified Slack, who has many past convictions. The defence was an alibi.

"I am innocent, so help me God,"

"I am innocent, so help me God," said Slack when asked if he had anything to say before sentence. "It is pretty hard to send an innocent man to

"I would fail in my duty if I did "I would fail in my duty if I did not regard you as an incorrigible offender. May this sentence be a warning to others that such horrible crimes will be punished to the full extent of the law," declared the judge.

Slack had been released on parole last December after serving eight years and nine months of a 12-years' sentence for assaulting Harry Aspden, an old man, and his wife and daughter, in their grocery at 216 Victoria-street. 
