Betting is Legal
If Not Recorded
In N. Y. State

NEW YORK, May 7.—There can be no bookmaking without writing or recording, under a decision of the appellate division of the New York State Supreme Court, rendered to-day in sustaining the writ of habeas corpus released from custody Orlando Jones and Sol Lichtenstein, two men who were arrested at the race tracks last summer on charges of violating the penal code by bookmaking, but were released by habeas corpus. The district attorney of Kings County appealed from this decision, but the appellate division sustained the lower court.

Racing men were particularly gratified to-day in that the decision is similar to one rendered in this county last fall in the Collins case, thus sustaining "oral betting" in both New York and Kings County, as far as the appellate division is concerned.

Robert H. Elder, assistant district attorney of Kings County, announced to-night that he would take immediate steps to appeal from the Gaynor decision to the state court of appeals at Albany. Judge Gaynor, he said, had quoted no authority to sustain the decision, but had merely asserted his own opinion.

The effect of to-day's ruling will be to accord bookmakers greater leeway during the season of 1909 than they enjoyed during the district attorney's raids of last season.
