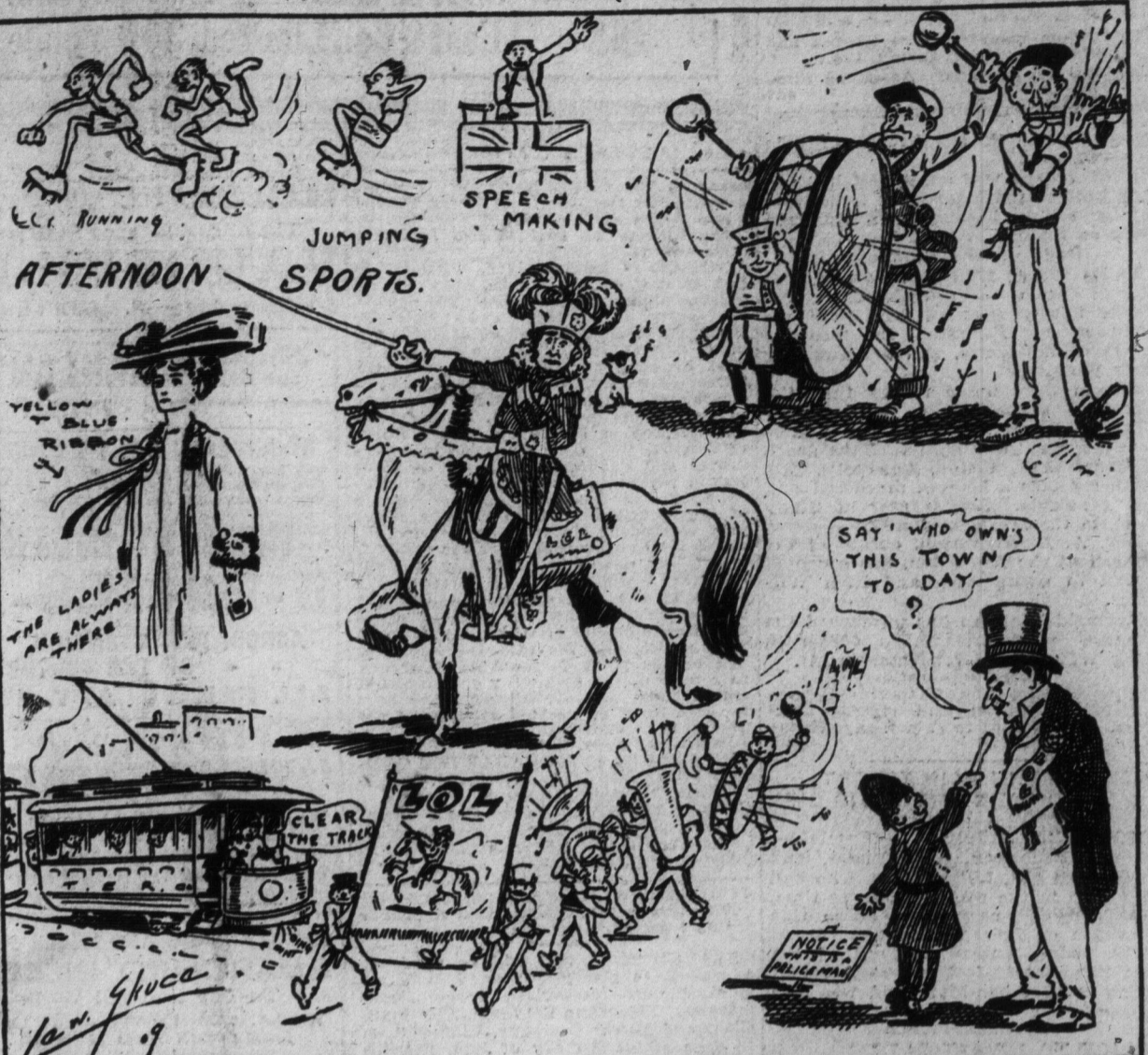

STEEL FREIGHTER IS RANDED 14 DOWN

Steamer Scott Sinks the Cowie in Lake Superior During an Early Morning Fog.

SAULT STE. MARIE, July 12.—Three minutes after the steel steamer Isaac M. Scott and John B. Cowie had collided in Lake Superior early this morning, about a mile and a half off Whitefish Point Lighthouse, the Cowie had gone to the bottom in 80 fathoms of water, carrying with her 14 members of her crew.

A heavy fog was responsible for the collision. The Scott, a new boat on her maiden trip, was struck on her starboard side by the bow of the Cowie, which was just passing the light at Whitefish Point and straightened out by the John B. Cowie's bow.
