St. John's, N.B., Times: The 180th Sportmen's Battalion is now quartered in the old quarters of the 115th Battalion, in the exhibition building. When called on this morning they seemed quite content and were very busy in getting things to rights, not too busy, however, to talk sport, but there is an excuse for that, when one learns that more than 600 of the men are athletes of no mean calibre, men that have won championships of cities, provinces, nations and the world.

No sooner had the men arrived in the city than they began to talk sport and waited on his worship the mayor and asked the privilege of giving an exhibition of sports, free to the public, a week from Saturday. As one member of the battalion put it, "We are called the Sportmen's Battalion, and we can prove that we are."
