The federal labor department, in whose employ he is, has loaned Mr. Hooper for the purpose. Proportional representation will be the system used in electing the members for Winnipeg to the provincial house, and for this purpose the city has been made into one electoral district, for which a group of members will be elected.

WHOLESALE FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

Strawberries—Canadian strawberries came in from freely Saturday and found a ready market, choice quality bringing the high price of 50c per box, and ranging from that down to 45c per box.

Asparagus was slightly easier in price, especially in the afternoon, when large shipments arrived. It opened at \$2.75 per 11-quart basket, but closed very weak, going as low as \$1.75 per 11-quart basket, due to some shoddy trade, as well as being heavy.

Lettuce was also a weaker trade at lower prices, some of the Boston head beginning to show waste right in its heart.

H. J. Ash had a car of strawberries, selling at 50c per box; Florida tomatoes at \$1.00 to \$1.10 per crate; beans at \$2.50 to \$3.00; carrots at \$2 to \$3 per bunch; Cal. grapefruit at \$4 to \$5 per crate; oranges at \$5 to \$6 per crate; cantaloupes at \$5 to \$6 per crate; onions at \$3 to \$4 per bushel; Canadian strawberries at 45c to 50c per box.

McWilliam Everist, Ltd. had a car of strawberries selling at 50c per box; a car of Valencia oranges at \$5.50 to \$6 per case; a car of Cal. lemons at \$5.50 to \$6 per case; a car of bananas at 10c per lb.; Boston head lettuce at 40c to 45c per bushel; Canadian head lettuce at 40c to 45c per bushel; rhubarb at 35c to 40c per dozen; potatoes at \$1.50 per bushel.

A. A. McKinnon had a car of new potatoes, 1 1/2" to 2" in size, selling at \$1.50 to \$1.75; Cal. lemons at \$5.50 to \$6 per case; a car of mixed vegetables—cabbage at \$5 per case; carrots at \$2.50 to \$3 per bunch; beans at \$3 to \$3.50 per bushel; a car of old potatoes at \$5.75 per bag.

D. Spence had new potatoes at \$1.50 to \$1.75 per bushel; Canadian head lettuce at 40c to 45c per bushel; beets and carrots at \$3.50 to \$4 per bushel; onions at \$3 to \$3.50 per bushel; potatoes at \$1.50 to \$1.75 per bushel; oranges at \$5 to \$6 per crate; cantaloupes at \$5 to \$6 per crate; old potatoes at \$5.75 per bag.
