

## REVIVE PROJECT OF NIAGARA BRIDGE

Both Countries Join Up in Campaign to Realize Traffic Solution.

Bridgeburg, Ont., Nov. 22.—With Councilman Bueley the prime mover, big efforts are being made across the river to revive the project of an additional bridge over the Niagara river at either Bridgeburg or Port Erie, to be constructed by the governments of both countries as a peace memorial bridge. The proposition had been held in abeyance on this side of the line since early this spring, owing to the failure of the American wing of the joint international committee to continue its efforts.

Now the work will again revive. The Canadian committee of twelve on this side of the river is preparing its campaign. The Buffalonians, however, are not content with endeavoring to get the New York State legislature to act in connection with the peace bridge scheme, but a delegation is going to Washington to endeavor to interest the federal authorities there in the measure.

The idea proposed now is to get the governments of both countries to make the necessary appropriations on a basis of fifty-fifty, in order to bring about the realization of the traffic question along the Niagara.

## High Prices in View for Mining Shares

The inflation of stock prices in the big markets has been effectively checked. Severe declines have taken place. Money is going to be scarce for a long time in view of restricted bank loans. Still lower prices for industrial stocks may therefore be looked for. The British Government is paying 15% premium for gold. It is to be anticipated that an international free market for the metal will be established shortly. This will serve to intensify the competition for gold and result in establishing a substantial and still higher premium for it. Owing to the continued scarcity of silver, prices are bound to be maintained at a high level for a long time to come. Consequently, gold and silver stocks are in a relatively stronger position than those of any other industry, and this position is being gradually improved consistent with production and decreasing costs.
