GREEN'S SLAYERS CAPTURED NEAR SCENE OF THEIR CRIME

FLOATED BONDS IN ENGLISH MARKET

William Mackenzie, of the C. N. R., Successfully Floats \$300,000,000 Worth of Bonds.

Toronto, Dec. 21.—"An electric railway along the line of the Electrical Development towers from Niagara to Toronto is a thing of the near future."

This was the announcement made by William Mackenzie this afternoon, just from England. The C. N. R. magnate issued denial of any knowledge of an electric merger but admitted the probability of a new suburban road from the falls to this city.

While admitting that he met Sir Henry Pollard in England, Mr. Mackenzie denied that there was any change in the situation as regards acquiring the Toronto Electric Light Company. Mackenzie declared that his whole mission in England had to do with floating certain bonds for the Montreal (Mexico) railway and water works and for the C. N. R. He floated 21,000,000 of bonds for the former and C. N. R. land grant bonds amounting to 25,000,000 were also floated. The former, bearing interest at 5 per cent, were disposed of at 99 and the C. N. R. 4 per cents at 95.

F. R. Crosby, of the finance department, Ottawa, and his brother, N. L. Crosby, of Pittsburgh, are at the Royal Hotel here. They have been called by the illness of their mother.

They Were Run to Earth Last Night— Found Frost Bitten Huddled in a Shack

Alex. Panarsky, The Jew, Who Was With Green When He Was Killed Identifies the Two Men as the Guilty Parties—None of the Booty Found on Them.

Plaster Rock, N. B., Dec. 21.—Covering in a shack, with feet and hands frozen, the two Italians, Leon Sepepla and Tony Arosca, who are wanted on the charge of murdering and robbing Edward Green, known as "Paddy" Green, peddler, last Sunday morning, were arrested this afternoon by Chief of G. T. P. Police A. R. Foster, on the right of way, not more than two miles from the scene of the tragedy. They denied all knowledge of the crime.

Alex. Panarsky, the Jew who was also shot at and narrowly escaped sharing Green's fate, has identified the men, and they are now in custody at Bishop's hotel here. They will be taken to Andover for the preliminary investigation before Commissioner Farris tomorrow morning.

Only a few dollars were found on the men when arrested, but it is believed they made off with about \$5,000 and forty watches after killing Green and rifling his peddler's box. A search for the missing booty will be made tomorrow.

The snow is about a foot deep in the woods and the thermometer below zero all night, and the weather is that the fugitives did not perish as they laid in the snow all night.

The whole district was thoroughly aroused over the cold-blooded character of the crime, and on Sunday as many as six parties were in pursuit of the murderers. Chief of G. T. P. Police A. R. Foster, with Constable Joseph Pearson left Bristol as soon as word reached them and drove to Beaufort Settlement, where they struck the right of way, and then turned up to head off the fugitives.

Parties from Johnston's camp, No. 1, and No. 2, kept watch all night at the point where the portage road crossed the right of way, and another party, under D. G. Johnston, the contractor, were on the look out at Wapke.

McDonald's camp sent a contingent to reach the "Lodgepole" valley, in the main road. A party under Constable MacLachlan, consisting of Benjamin Gee, Seymour Trafton, the game warden, Time Keeper, King and others, spent the night in going from one camp to another, and on the west side of the Tobique river from Phillips and Esquimaux camp, were on the alert to prevent the fugitives from joining the Italian camp in the neighborhood, where their identity would have been lost.

All this morning the well on into the afternoon the search was continued. In the night, the fugitives, who were constantly doubled on their tracks, and circled around in a wide circle, which added to the difficulties of tracking them.

With the assistance of Benjamin Gee, who acted as guide, the posse under Constable MacLachlan picked up the trail this morning and, following it up, discovered where the men had lain down in the snow and lighted a fire. In another spot the remains of a lunch were found, and further on the party came on a large pile of furs and a heavy blanket.

Frozen swamps, where the brush was so thick that the tracks could scarcely be seen, were encountered and added to the difficulties. Other parties came upon the tracks, lost them, and found them again, and in some places it appeared as if the men had made desperate attempts to baffle their pursuers by jumping from the top of windfalls.

Chief of Police Foster was scouring the country in the neighborhood of the crime, Chief of Police Foster and Constable Pearson were driving up the right of way from Beaufort Settlement. They traveled some twenty-five miles on Sunday and spent the night at Gilmore's residence, by previous arrangement. They were joined there by G. W. Bishop, of Plaster Rock, and James McLean, resident engineer on the G. T. P., and together the four started out again early this morning. Frequent excursions were made into the woods, and by noon the camp of Contractor Moore and Stubbie was reached and a halt was called for dinner. Resuming their drive up the right of way, it was about 4 o'clock when the party, in crossing the track, came in sight of a shack used by the Italian laborers. A little boy was splitting wood in the door way.

Chief of Police Foster was the first to enter. The first glance into the interior told him that the hunt was an end. With feet and hands frozen and looking utterly done up and dejected, crouched the two Italians. They made no attempt at resistance. When asked what they were doing there, one who could speak English replied that they had just come along the right of way from Plaster Rock.

This was known to be incorrect; as a posse of men were guarding the right of way. Evidence of the men's foot prints where they had come out of the woods close by was clearly seen in the snow. They were promptly handcuffed and placed in the sleigh and a start was made for Plaster Rock.

The spot where they were discovered was about two miles from the scene of the murder, on the right of way. Panarsky, the Jew, who was with Green, was overtaken in company with R. K. Beveridge, the coroner. He at once identified the Italians as the men who had done the shooting.

On arrival at Plaster Rock the men were taken to Bishop's hotel and searched. On Leon Sepepla was found \$37 in money, a razor and a large open knife and a few pieces of jewelry. A few dollars were also found on Tony Arosca. The two found on them is believed to have been in their possession before the shooting. It is supposed that the proceeds of the robbery have been hidden. A thorough search, starting from the shack from where the men were found, will be made tomorrow.

When questioned, the Italians denied all knowledge of the crime. One of them, who would appear to be not more than twenty years old, was much exhausted. It is believed they would not have survived another night in the open. After having eaten some supper they went to bed in charge of Chief Foster, who will look after them for the night. They will be taken to Andover in the morning, where a preliminary hearing will take place before Commissioner Farris, who is
