PROSPECT IS REASSURING

J. S. Bache & Co. Convinced That the Financial Situation is Improving Rapidly.

NEW YORK, Dec. 28.—The banking position as exhibited in the reports of national banks throughout the country and in the reports of state banks and trust companies of this state is shown to be strong, and the conclusions are reassuring. This applies to trust companies as well as to other banking institutions. AGAINST SUNDAY CLOSING
