## LEGAL BATTLE FOR MILLIONS IS ENDED

Boston, July 8.—The legal battle for the \$2,000,000 estate left by Louis Cabot is ended.

Settlement of the famous case has come after an agreement arrived at between the testator's children, Mrs. Mary C. Briggs, wife of Dr. L. Vernon Briggs, and Mrs. Charlotte W. Bartol, wife of Dr. John W. Bartol.

While the terms of the settlement are not known it is learned from the highest authority that Mrs. Briggs, who contested the will, won practically all in court—40 trial days.

Under the will disposing of about \$2,000,000, Mrs. Briggs and her sister were cut off in favor of their children—the seven grandchildren of the eccentric millionaire sportsman.

But as Mrs. Briggs had but one child her share would only have been \$200,000 while the Bartol family, with six children, would have received the balance of the estate. Consequently Mrs. Briggs endeavored to break the will as unfair and unduly in favor of the children.

A meeting of the sisters and their counsel was arranged for last Friday. It took place in Mr. Choate's office and, after long discussion terms of settlement were arrived at and an agreement signed.
