\$15 Toll For 3-Minute Talk Across Ocean
LONDON, Dec. 28.—Trans-Atlantic telephone service which is to be available to the public early in January, will cost \$15 (about \$75) for the first three minutes of a call and 25 for each additional minute. It was announced today by the postmaster-general.
The numbers won't count, however, and unless the London "Hello girls" gets the particular person asked for in the New York area to which the service is limited at present, the charge will be \$2 for making the attempt. Calls will be limited to 12 minutes when others are waiting to talk across the ocean. 12-31

WHARF INVENTORY EXPECTED TO BEGIN
Appraisal of Halifax Property Reported to be Started
HALIFAX, N. S., Dec. 28.—It was reported on the waterfront today that an inventory and appraisal of the piers and wharves of Halifax Harbor would shortly be made by the department of public works on instruction of the federal government. While no announcement has been made, it is said that this is being done as a preparatory step in the event that the recommendation of the Duncan commission that Halifax wharves be turned over to a harbor commission, is implemented by parliament.
The railway, military and naval piers now owned by the government constitute a goodly portion of the waterfront, but there are very many wharves that are privately owned. If the recommendation should be adopted it is believed that it would eventually involve the purchase of all these wharves that are privately owned. Two Overtime Periods Necessary to Decide Contest—Fast Game
SUSSEX, Dec. 28.—Two overtime periods were necessary here tonight to decide a winner between Fredericton and Sussex, when the latter boys finally pulled out ahead with a narrow margin of one goal. The final count was 4 to 3. Each team scored a goal in the first period. Keanan, of Fredericton, being the first to score in 18 minutes. H. Radcliff, with his old time speed and head work, equalled the score in 16 minutes play. There were no further goals in this period, although both goal keepers were frequently called upon to save and both played a remarkable game.
SECOND PERIOD.
In the second period Chalmers, for Fredericton, made the first tally in three minutes. Hunter followed with a nice shot in five minutes and in six and a half minutes repeated again. This ended the scoring in this period which was somewhat slower than the first. Two slight accidents occurred during second period. Clark, of Fredericton, slid into the boards, injuring his head and had to be replaced. Shortly after Keanan was accidentally struck in the face with a stick but was able to go on.
THIRD PERIOD.
The third period was a clever exhibition on the part of both teams. Sussex showing great determination to hold their lead, while Fredericton were equally determined to notch the tying goal, which Sussex successfully accomplished two minutes before the gong rang. In the first ten minutes of overtime there was no score and it was left for H. Radcliff to make the winning shot; four and a half minutes after the second stanza of overtime. TO HANDLE MANY CRIMINAL CASES
Charges Range All The Way From Manslaughter to Theft of Liquor
FREDERICTON, Dec. 28.—York county and the city of Fredericton between them have produced an imposing array of criminal business for trial before the courts meeting in this city in January. Both the York County Court and the court of King's Bench are available for these cases. But the time is hardly sufficient to get all the cases ready for the County Court which it is expected will subsequently the Court of King's Bench must try some of them.
There is a wide range of charges. The most serious is that of manslaughter. Two cases are of theft, liquor being taken in each case. There is a charge of indecent assault on a little girl and the possibility of a life charge in connection with the assault. 2 DETROIT BANDITS ROB BANK OF \$18,000
DETROIT, Mich., Dec. 28.—After standing guard over two employees for half an hour waiting for the bank manager to arrive, two bandits looted the vault of the Commonwealth Federal Savings Bank branch at Davidson and Woodward Wilson avenues of \$18,000.
The two bandits followed Kenneth Lyons, teller, and Mrs. Elizabeth Burton, bookkeeper, into the bank this morning and forced them to stand at their desks as if at work, pending arrival of the manager. When the latter arrived he was forced to open the vault. The bandits removed all the paper currency and escaped.
