

Bride Bent on Honeymoon Abroad Finds She's Misaid Her Nationality

Boston Born, Living in Yonkers, Became Austrian by Marriage; Now He's American, She's Alien.

Many puzzles come before Ira Hoyt, chief of the local passport bureau, as he announced her intention of becoming an American citizen again. This will require ninety days, according to the law, and so the honeymoon set for August, will take place in the late fall. "Well, have our honeymoon in Europe if it takes three years and not three months," said Mrs. Letz. "I'd like to see them stop an American-born girl living in Yonkers from getting anywhere she likes. It's a good thing, though, that we're not in a hurry about it."

She went to Chief Hoyt for her passport and here the difficulties started. They are briefly, though not simply, as follows:

George Letz, her husband, came here from Trieste in 1911, when Trieste was a province of Austria. Consequently, he was an Austrian. Mrs. Letz, whom he married in 1922, was an American-born girl, in fact, from Boston. By marrying an alien, she lost her citizenship. The law enabling a citizen to retain her rights even though marrying an alien did not pass until several weeks after the Letzes were wed. Now, when Letz did become a citizen, July 24—that is, last Tuesday—Mrs. Letz remained an alien, under the law of September, 1922. Accordingly, Letz could go to Trieste, but his wife, American-born couldn't, being an alien. Accordingly, she went to the Austrian consulate to get a passport, but was informed Trieste is now Italian, and she had to go to the Italian consul.

Cohen, in charge of injunction proceedings in the office of the United States Attorney, Colonel William Haywood.
