SLAIN WITH A HAMMER, INSANE WIFE IS HELD

Woman Just Released from Hospital Accused of Killing Yonkers Man as He Slept.

(New York Times.)
A Sidney Tomlinson, fifty years old, superintendent of construction for Gillis & Geoghegan, steamfitters, of 337-9 West Broadway, was found dead in bed in his home at 4 Cornell avenue, Yonkers, yesterday. His head had been crushed by repeated blows with a hammer, found in the room. Mrs. Mary W. Tomlinson, fifty-two, his wife, who had been paroled from the Hudson River State Hospital for the Insane in Poughkeepsie last Saturday, was arrested and held on the charge of murder. The only other person in the house at the time was Richard Young, nineteen years old, a nephew of Tomlinson. Young was exonerated.

The nephew told Coroner Engle and the police that the occupants of the house went to bed about ten o'clock Monday night, each occupying separate rooms. Tomlinson and his wife slept in connecting rooms. Three times in the night, the nephew said, he was awakened by the opening of his door and the entrance of Mrs. Tomlinson. Each time she said that she was nervous and could not sleep. The third time she asked if she could sleep at the foot of his bed, and made a couch for herself on the floor.

Young said that he awakened at eight o'clock. Mrs. Tomlinson had left the room. He dressed and looked into Tomlinson's room and found his uncle lying dead on a blood-stained bed. Then he went downstairs and saw Mrs. Tomlinson in the dining room. Frightened, he
