Hospital Accused of Killing Yonkers Man as He Slept.

Sidney Tomlinson, fifty years old, superintendent of construction for Gillis & Geoghegan, steamfitters, of 537-9 West Broadway, was found dead in bed-in his home at 4 Cornell avenue, Yonk-ers, yesterday. His head had been crushed by repeated blows with a ham-mer, found in the room. Mrs. Mary W. Tomlinson, fifty-two, his wife, who had been paroled from the Hadson River State Hospital for the Insane in Pough-keepsie last Saturday, was arrested and held on the charge of murder.
